- 3.26 Major Activities during the year in the sphere of extension activities and Institutional Social Responsibility
 - ➤ Collage Competition: As part of environmental protection awareness a collage competition was organized on the topic-Save the Mother Earth Cash prizes were given to the winners.
 - ➤ Training in Bag making: A training programme was organized in connection with 'Save your Environment by Reusing Solid Waste'. Ms. SumathiSuvarna, Guest faculty, RUDSETI, Brahmavar had given training to the students to make paper and cloth carry bags, that can replace plastic carry bags
 - ➤ Training in Vermi Composting: In association with the Zonal Agricultural Research Centre, Brahamavar, A vermi composting demonstration class was conducted in the Centre The students were given the responsibility of passing on the knowledge to the villagers.
 - > Career orientation and Leadership Training Camp
 - ➤ A Career exploration and Leadership Training Camp was held in the college in association with YMCA, Brahmavar. The camp was organized for the benefit of students who have completed 10th and PUC classes. Training in Basic English Grammar, basic computer knowledge, Basic Soft Skills and awareness on possible courses were provided.
 - ➤ Wall of Charity: Realizing the needs of the community and to encourage social service, a project 'Wall of Charity' was inaugurated in the college. The aim of the project is to help the needy. It is a place to keep things 'you don't want or to take things you want'. Anybody can keep things which are usable but are not used anymore and anybody can take things which they want.
 - ➤ Blood Donation: In association with Y.R.C, K.M.C, Manipal and MoghaveeraSangha, Pethri, a blood donation camp was organized on 24^h January 2018. About 65 units of blood were collected. Students also got an opportunity to know their blood group.
 - ➤ Anti- Plastic Campaign In association with Y.R.C, NSS volunteers did the Flash Mob and Street Play at Brahmavara town on 26th January 2018 about the problems causing through plastics.

- ➤ Free Eye Check up camp: In association with Y.R.C and Prasad Nethralaya Udupi, a free eye check up camp was organized for the students and the public. About 100 students and public registered their names for eye check up.
 - ➤ An Indian One Rupee Project "Medical Relief Fund" collected Rs. 5, 343 from the students to be used for providing medical relief.
 - ➤ Contribution towards the Medical expenses of a baby who is the D/o Mrs. Saraswathi, Neelavara, who is undergoing treatment at KMC, Manipal Rs. 18, 680.
 - ➤ Contribution towards the Medical expenses and high risk surgery of Mr.Akhilesha, a student of Govt. First Grade College, Barkur Rs.15, 455.
 - ➤ Contribution towards the Medical expenses of Mr.Manish, a student of Govt. First Grade College, Kota, Padukere Rs.12, 841.
- ➤ Contribution towards the Medical expenses of the girl Ms.Mehek, Shimoga Taluk, who is undergoing Cancer treatment at KMC, Manipal Rs. 9, 113.
- ➤ College donated Rs. 3,430 and 1.1 quintals of rice to the Spandana, a home for the differently abled people at Udupi. This was collected through the project "A Handful of Rice with Love" (Collection of rice and money on the occasion of Samsmaran Din, Founder's Death Anniversary).

Best Practice – 1

Title: Wall of Charity

Wall of charity is a small initiative to help out those brothers and sisters who are in need but don't have the means to buy new clothes and other items. It is a small effort to make a difference and unify us with our brothers and sisters who need our help.

Goal

- To develop the spirit of giving and sharing among the students and staff of the college by way of depositing the usable unused items of daily use to be used by others.
- This practice aligns with the Mission of the College to encourage the spirit of service in staff and students.
- To instil compassion among the citizens
- To bring happiness to others through charity
- To create a positive impact on society

The Context

In the society there is always a gap between the "haves" and the "have nots". The "haves" possess a lot of material things and often much of it is not used but simply lie in their homes. On the other hand the "have nots" can't afford to buy even the basic items

of daily use. By creating an avenue for depositing the unused items at home can help the haves to share what they have and at the same time help the have nots to use them. The Wall of Charity in the college can act as a conduit to facilitate this process.

The Practice

This project was initiated with the noble intention of promoting the spirit of giving among the staff and students of the college. A separate room with shelves and other provisions is provided in the college. This room is kept open for anyone to deposit the items and for any one who wish to pick any useful item. The staff and students can bring any item of daily use and deposit it in the "Wall of charity". It is totally anonymous. The items include clothes, books, writing materials, bags, watches, files, etc. The project is practiced on the basis of the motto-"If you don't need it, leave it. If you need it, take it." For making it a reality a room is separated for students, staff and any interested people to drop items they don't need and to collect items which they need. Wall of Kindness is for various items like clothes, stationery items, food, books and notebooks as well. Dropping and taking things are done voluntarily as it is not supervised by any one and no records are kept for the items.

Evidence of success

The staff and students have actively participated in this project by bringing variety of items. Most of the items deposited by the donors have been taken by the students.

Problems encountered and resources required

As the idea was not clearly understood by many there was initial reluctance in dropping and picking items which were displayed. Since it is kept in a room in the college it is not easily accessible to public.

Best Practice -2

Title: Value Education Initiatives

Goal

To inculcate the basic human values in students. To motivate the students to develop the right attitudes and practice the good values in day to day life.

Context

With the breaking of the joint families and the entry of television sets in the living rooms the dominance of communication devices the youth are becoming less sensitive to others needs and more selfish. This disturbs the basic fabric of the society. In order to expose

the young students in the college to the basic human values, various value education initiatives have been undertaken.

Practices

- 1. **Motivational Talks:** Every morning, the day begins with a motivational talk laden with some quotes and stories to communicate some values to students. In the beginning of each month a list is prepared with the date and the concerned student or teacher who would give the motivation talk.
- 2. **Moral Instruction classes:** Each teacher spends some time during an assigned period sharing some moral stories, experiences or videos to teach some values.
- 3. **Class room cleaning:** The students themselves clean the classroom by taking turns, This gives them a sense of self discipline
- 4. **Medical relief fund:** Each class has a box in order to make collection from students that could be used for medical relief needy students.
- 5. **Celebration of National days:** The college community celebrates the important national days with the dedication to work for the betterment of the society.
